Discussion/Activity 1:

Fortune:

- a. Was Shobei just lucky, or did he deserve his good fortune?
- b. When Shobei was given a bag of gold coins (equivalent of a modern day win on the lottery) he bought a house and land for his family and friends. What would the children do if they came into a lot of money? Categorise these into **Needs, Wants and Wishes** (Print out Powerpoint slide 27 for recording purposes).

Discussion/Activity 2

Money

a. Discuss the following concepts:

- Money has value because you can trade it for something else.
- Putting money aside to spend later is called saving.
- Saving allows you to buy something in the future when you do not have enough money today.
- You can keep track of money by keeping it in a safe place e.g. a bank, safe, piggy bank.
- The 3 S's: saving, spending, sharing.

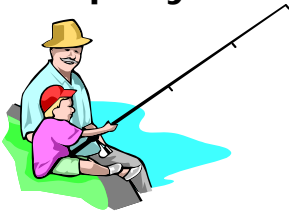
b. Make a list of activities which don't cost anything.

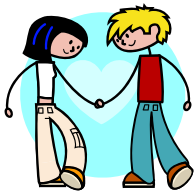
