





The National Healthy Schools Programme aims to help children, young people and their schools to be healthy.

Healthier children do better in learning and in life. By enabling children and young people to make positive changes to their behaviour regarding health and wellbeing, schools can help them reach their full potential in terms of achievement and fulfillment. Healthy Schools involves the whole school community – children, parents, governors and school staff.

Focussing on a whole-school approach to physical and emotional well-being, the programme has four main themes:

- Personal, Social and Health Education
- Healthy Eating
- Physical Activity
- Emotional Health and Well-being.

The DfE has stated as part of its National Curriculum guidance that 'All schools should make provision for personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE), drawing on good practice.' In the absence of a new programme of study from the DfE, the PSHE Association has produced a revised programme of study.

This programme of study is based on three core themes:

- 1. Health and Wellbeing
- 2. Relationships
- 3. Living in the Wider World.

We have set out in the tables below the Go-Givers lessons that relate to these themes, which in turn cover the 1st and 4th Healthy Schools themes. At this time we do not provide for the themes: Healthy Eating and Physical Activity.
