UNICEF's mission is to advocate for the protection of children's rights, to help meet their basic needs and to expand their opportunities to reach their full potential.

Teaching children about the UNICEF Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC), which was ratified by the United Nations in 1989, enables them to know and understand the legal and human rights and responsibilities that underpin society. They will discover that:

- They have rights
- They should be informed about their rights
- They should be helped to exercise their rights
- They should be able to enforce their rights
- There should be a community of interest to advocate young people's rights.

The Convention is an excellent starting point for understanding global citizenship.
